

THE CDBG "WHAT"

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

- HUD funding to entitled cities and counties distributed on a formula basis.
 - Principal Cities in MSA
 - Metro cities with population > \$50,000
 - Counties with population > 200,000 excluding entitled cities.



THE CDBG "WHAT"

Purpose/ Use of Funds

- National Objectives
 - 1. Benefit LMI populations
 - 2. Aid in prevention of slums or blight
 - 3. Meet other urgent community development needs

\succ Use of Funds

- Acquisition of property/demolition
- Rehab (homes and facilities)
- Construction of public facilities and improvements
- Public services
- Energy conservation/renewable energy resources
- Assistance to profit-motivated businesses



THE CDBG "WHAT"

Citizen Participation

- The Consolidated Plan identifies a community's priority needs in the areas of <u>community</u> <u>development</u> and <u>affordable housing</u> and proposes <u>strategies</u> on how to best use the resources available to meet those needs.
- The Consolidated Plan is an application for <u>Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)</u>, a grant designed to meet the needs of <u>low- and moderate-income</u> residents.


CDBG funds are meant to help working-class families and households earning less than 80% of the area's median income.


- 30,675 households (1 of every 4) qualify for assistance per HUD CHAS data
- Includes firefighters (\$59,550), kindergarten teachers (\$57,900), machinists (\$47,560) and office clerks (\$41,910) – per BLS.


CDBG ELIGIBLE AREAS


Percent of Population qualified as Low Mod Income






POVERTY IN HAMILTON CO


